

# In-Hand Showing Guide

## PRE's & PRE Associated Breeds



### Presentation

#### Females

For both English and Spanish presentation

- Hogged mane and hogged top of tail and tail cut to length accordingly
- OR
- Mane plaited in balls or long plait. Tail - loose

#### Males

- If being presented in English tack and handler, the mane is to be plaited in either balls or long plait.
- If being presented in Spanish tack, then the mane should be left loose
- Tails loose for English and Spanish presentation
  
- Excess hair from under chin and fetlocks can be trimmed.
- Clear hoof oil or varnish

#### In-hand bridles

- Spanish in-hand chain presentation bridle and rope or sarreta
- English in-hand youngstock bridle
- Snaffle or double bridle for horse 4+ yrs of age

#### Handler Dress

- English riding attire – Dark jacket, breeches, long boots, tie/stock, hat
- Spanish traje corto (country suit), campera boots, sombrero

#### Showing your horse

When called forward by the steward, present the horse in front of the judge standing still and square, on the judge's instruction proceed to walk away in a strait line as instructed. Turn the horse and trot back towards the judge continuing past them in a straight line, then proceed to trot round the arena and back to the judge in the centre, halt. Return to the line up.

The Judges decision is final
